Final Week of Apartheid Exhibit

Two New Exhibits and Noted Authors Scheduled for August

ATLANTA, GA.- This is the final week to see “From Apartheid to Democracy: The Struggle for Freedom in South Africa and the American South”. This fascinating and informative exhibition traces the changes that took place in South Africa and compares them with the Civil Rights Movement in the American South. In addition, you will see an exact replica of Nelson Mandela’s jail cell. This exhibit ends July 31st.

Coming in August are two exciting photographic exhibitions. “**Diana Walker: Photojournalist**” opens on Saturday, August 26th. For twenty-five years, Diana Walker covered the White House, photographing five Presidents and their family in public and private moments. The exhibition includes 83 selected photographs and nine magazine covers from Walker’s vast collection.

Produced by the Smithsonian’s National Museum of American History and organized for travel by the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service (SITES), the exhibition takes a look at candid moments in the lives of the American presidents; foreign dignitaries and their relationship to America; political activists and boxing champion Muhammad Ali.

Along with the Walker photographs, visitors will be able to see Pace Academy’s 30-piece photography show, “**Developing Conscience: The Invisible American**”. This unique exhibition showcases the talents of ten student photographers and includes unforgettable images from the Atlanta immigrant community, displaced hurricane Katrina survivors, and the veteran homeless population. This exhibition opens August 29th.

Three important authors will speak at the Carter Presidential Library in August. On Wednesday, August 2nd, former Ambassador Peter Galbraith will discuss his new book “The End of Iraq: How American Incompetence Created a War Without End.”

On Wednesday, August 23rd, author Philip Grose is joined by former Governor Robert McNair to discuss the book “**South Carolina At the Brink**”. As the governor of South Carolina during the height of the civil rights movement, Robert E. McNair faced the task of leading the state through the dismantling of its pervasive Jim Crow culture. In telling McNair’s story, Philip G. Grose recounts historic moments of epic turbulence, chronicles the development of the man himself, and maps the course of action that defined his leadership.

The following day, award-winning travel journalist Mike Tidwell will talk about hurricane Katrina and the potential for future Katrina’s. His book “**Ravaging Tide: How Future Katrinas will be More Frequent, More Ferocious and More Fatal to America’s Cities,**” is sure to stir debate about the way we develop along the coastlines.

All author lectures are at 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by a book signing.
