WHITE HOUSE PHOTOJOURNALIST AND WHITE HOUSE ASPIRANT COMING TO CARTER LIBRARY NEXT WEEK
PHOTOGRAPHER DIANA WALKER ON NOV. 15TH & SEN. JOHN EDWARDS ON NOV. 17TH

Atlanta, GA. - The Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum hosts White House Photographer Diana Walker and potential Presidential candidate John Edwards in special author lectures and book signings next week.

On Wednesday, November 15th, veteran White House photojournalist Diana Walker will discuss her twenty-five years of covering the President, First Family and world leaders. An exhibit of more than eighty of Walker's photographs is currently on display at the Carter Presidential Museum. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m. to allow visitors to see the exhibit **Diana Walker: Photojournalist** free of charge. At 7:30 p.m., Walker will discuss her work photographing Presidents from Gerald Ford to Bill Clinton. Following her lecture, Walker will sign copies of her book, "Public and Private: Twenty Years Photographing the Presidency."
