CHURCHILL AUTHOR COMING TO CARTER LIBRARY

LYNNE OLSON TO READ FROM TROUBLESOME YOUNG MEN

Atlanta, GA. – Former White House correspondent Lynne Olson comes to the Carter Presidential Library on Wednesday, June 5th to read from her new book **“Troublesome Young Men: The Rebels Who Brought Churchill to Power and Helped Save England.”** Co-sponsored by the Georgia Center for the Book, the reading will be at 7 p.m. in the Carter Library Theater and will be followed by a book-signing. The lecture is free and open to the public. Doors open at 6:30 p.m.
