AUTHOR STEPHEN CARTER TONIGHT AT CARTER LIBRARY

FINAL TWO WEEKS TO TAKE "A VIEW FROM THE PERISCOPE"

Atlanta, GA. - Don't miss hearing author Stephen L. Carter talk about his new, highly-acclaimed novel "Palace Council" tonight at the Carter Presidential Library.

Library Journal says "In his previous novels, Yale Law professor Carter has delighted in bending genres. His latest is no exception, at once a hyperbolic thriller and a subtle and convincing comedy of manners. ... Few authors are better than Carter at capturing the nuances of human behavior on both sides of the color line." The lecture and book signing is co-sponsored by the Georgia Center for the Book and is free and open to the public. Doors to the Carter Library open at 6:30 pm and Carter's reading begins at 7:00 p.m. Copies of "Palace Council" will be available for purchasing and signing at the event.

In celebration of Jimmy Carter's becoming a submariner 60 years ago, the Carter Presidential Library and Museum is displaying this exhibition of paintings and drawings from the United States Naval Historical Center's art collection. These paintings provide a unique look at the role of the U.S. Submarine Service. This fascinating exhibition includes a 1902 drawing of the first submarine, *Hunley*, as well as 42 other historic paintings and drawings from WWII to the 1980s. Artists such as Thomas Hart Benton, Georges Schreiber, and John Charles Roach capture the mystery of the submarine and the adventurous nature of those who serve on them.
