AUTHORS ON CHINA COMING TO CARTER LIBRARY

True Stories on Intrigue and Economics That You Won't Want To Miss

Atlanta, GA.- The All New Jimmy Carter Presidential Library's author lecture series focuses on China for its next two free book signings. First, on Tuesday, October 27th at 7pm, we will present Emmy Award-winning broadcast journalist Lynn Joiner. Her new book, ***Honorable Survivor: Mao's China, McCarthy's America and the Persecution of John S. Service***, tells a true tale of intrigue, adventure, and persecution. It is the story of an idealistic U.S. Foreign Service officer, John Service, in wartime China who early on predicted Mao Zedong's successful revolution. Service became America's key liaison with the Communist Chinese when General Joseph Stilwell wanted their help against the Japanese. Later, he became a target of revenge for the Nationalist Chinese, a convenient scapegoat for American politicians eager to advance their careers, and a "person of interest" to J. Edgar Hoover for more than a quarter century.

One week later, on Tuesday November 3rd, Zachary Karabell will discuss his new book ***Superfusion: How China and America Became One Economy and Why the World's Prosperity Depends on It***.

Karabell is President of River Twice Research, where he analyzes economic and political trends. *Publishers Weekly* says "Karabell delivers a compelling brief on the unlikely convergence of the U.S. and Chinese economies. He begins with an introduction to China's economic reforms in the post-Mao era and moves on to specific examples of how such American companies as KFC, Avon and Nike used this opportunity to reinvent their businesses to suit the world's largest market. Karabell argues that China's entry into the WTO laid the foundations of "Chimerica"—the symbiotic relationship between China and America that has largely escaped analysis because outmoded quantitative tools examine nation states as closed systems."
