Creator Information: Gary M. Fink

Gary M. Fink was born in 1936 to John and Martha Fink. He grew up on a farm in Forsyth, Montana. After being stationed in Whittier, Alaska during the Korean War, Gary earned an undergraduate degree from the University of Montana, where he met his wife, Mary. He later earned a PhD from the University of Missouri. Gary was a longtime Atlanta resident and Braves fan. He taught at Georgia State for over 25 years, where he chaired the Department of History for seven years (1984-1991). He researched local labor movements, Georgia history, and the political career of Jimmy Carter; and authored many books. He also taught graduate seminars at the Carter Library, was a recipient of a Governor's Award in the Humanities, and served as president of the Georgia Association of Historians. Gary, Georgia State University professor emeritus, noted author and labor historian passed away in 2008.
