E.L. Doctorow & Walter Mosley at Carter Library This Week Best-Selling Authors to Discuss Their Latest Works & Autograph Books

Atlanta, GA. - Best-selling authors E.L. Doctorow and Walter Mosley will talk about their latest novels at free lectures and book-signings this week at the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum.

Doctorow's novel, *The March* is currently # 4 on the New York Times best-seller list. It re-imagines Sherman's march through Georgia and the Carolinas, which produced hundreds of thousands of deaths and untold collateral damage. In this powerful novel, Doctorow gets deep inside the pillage, cruelty and destruction-as well as the care and burgeoning love that sprung up in their wake.

Booklist wrote "Heir to Stephen Crane's *The Red Badge of Courage*, Doctorow's masterpiece uncovers the roots of today's racial and political conundrums, and taps into the deep and abiding realm of myth in its illumination of sorrow and beauty the continuity of human existence, and the transcendence of tenacity, compassion, and love."

E.L. Doctorow will discuss *The March* at 8 p.m., on Tuesday, October 11th at the Carter Center's Day Chapel. The lecture and book-signing is free and open to the public. Doors open at 7 p.m.

On Friday, October 14th, best-selling writer Walter Mosley will discuss his new book *Cinnamon Kiss*. Mosley is the author of nineteen critically acclaimed books and his work has been translated into twenty-one languages. His popular mysteries featuring Easy Rawlins began with *Devil in a Blue Dress* in 1990.

Mosley's sizzling new novel pits Easy Rawlins against his greatest challenge ever--a terrifying murder during the Summer of Love. Mosley has also recently published his first book for young adult readers, "47." It is an ingenious mix of history, science fiction, and adventure.

Walter Mosley will speak in the Carter Presidential Museum Theater at 8 p.m. Friday, October 14th. The lecture and book-signing is free and open to the public. Doors open at 7 p.m.
