AUTHORS YOU WON'T WANT TO MISS AT CARTER LIBRARY

STEPHEN BERRY ON THURSDAY (NOV. 8) AND VICENTE FOX ON MONDAY (NOV. 12)

ATLANTA, GA.- The Carter Presidential Library and Georgia Center for the Book host an important series of major authors in November.

On Thursday, November 8th, Stephen Berry reads from his new biography “**The House of Abraham: Lincoln and the Todds, A Family Divided by War.**” *Publishers Weekly* calls the book “*a fast-paced, sobering story, never better told, of the pains of a clan and their significance for American history.*” The 7 p.m. reading is in the Carter Library Theater and will be followed by a book signing.

On Monday, November 12th, the former President of Mexico, Vicente Fox comes to the Carter Library to discuss his fascinating new book “**Revolution of Hope: The Life, Faith, and Dreams of a Mexican President.**” *The Washington Post* says Fox’s book “*makes a direct plea to the American people to see Mexican immigrants in a kinder light. He wants us to have patience with Mexico’s fledgling efforts at political and economic reform, and to seek common solutions rather than building walls.*”

President Fox will speak in the lobby of the Carter Museum. Seating is limited. Doors open at 6 p.m. and the reading begins at 7:00 p.m. Following the reading, Fox will sign copies of his book.

Also next week, Hugh Howard and Roger Strauss will present breath-taking photographs from their new book “**Houses of the Founding Fathers.**” Their reading will be at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, November 14th.

Two days later, on Friday, November 16th, Daniel Howe will discuss “**What God Hath Wrought: The Transformation of America 1815-1848.**” *Publishers Weekly* says “*supported by engaging prose, Howe’s achievement will surely be seen as one of the most outstanding syntheses of U.S. history published this decade.*”
