





## “School House to White House” Coming to Carter Library Education of the Presidents Exhibit Fascinating for Whole Family

Atlanta, GA.– In late 1925, a twelve year old boy in California wrote an essay in school saying that he “would like to study law and enter politics for an occupation so that I might be of some good to the people.”



Just over four decades later, that boy, Richard Milhous Nixon, was elected the nation’s 37th president.




Richard Nixon’s school essay is just one of more than 150 documents, photographs, artifacts and mementos that will be on display as the Carter Presidential Library & Museum presents “School House to White House: The Education of the Presidents.” The exhibition, which will be on display from September 13th through January 4th, spotlights the early life and education of every president from Herbert Hoover to George W. Bush.



This family-friendly exhibition will engage visitors of every age and interest. Documents, artifacts, photos and films drawn from the collections of the National Archives eleven Presidential Libraries reveal fascinating details about children who would grow up to be president.
