Author Aaron Glantz comes to the Carter Library at 7pm Tuesday to discuss and sign his new book *“The War Comes Home: Washington’s Battle Against America’s Veterans.”* Publishers Weekly writes “This exposé of the treatment meted out to American veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan is a breathtaking rebuke to government hypocrisy and an overdue contribution to gaining critical public awareness of this official neglect.” You won’t want to miss this important and timely talk. Glantz’s lecture is co-sponsored by the Carter Center Mental Health Program and Acappella Books. It is free and open to the public. Copies of “The War Comes Home” will be sold at the lecture. Doors open at 6:30pm

On Thursday, author David Cox comes to the Carter Presidential Library to discuss his book about his crusading journalist father and the “dirty war” in Argentina. *“Dirty Secrets, Dirty War”* tells the story of Robert Cox, the editor of the English-language Buenos Aires Herald, the only Argentinean paper that consistently covered kidnappings and murders by government security forces. This is a story that you will remember for a long time. Following his free lecture, Cox will sign copies of his book. The lecture will be in the Carter Museum theater. Doors open at 6:30 pm.
