STORYTELLERS RETURN TO CARTER LIBRARY

Turkeys, Pilgrims and Indian Corn

ATLANTA— Join us the day after Thanksgiving for *Turkeys, Pilgrims and Indian Corn: Thanksgiving Stories You Will Relish*. Members of the Southern Order of Storytellers will perform Thanksgiving stories for the whole family in the Carter Presidential Museum Theater at 2pm on Friday, November 27th.

Admission to the hour-long storytelling is included at no extra charge with your normal museum admission. And don't forget, **museum admission for children sixteen years old and younger is FREE.**

The Thanksgiving holiday is a wonderful time to visit the all new Carter Presidential Museum. The museum was completely redesigned this year. It is bright, colorful and full of videos and interactive exhibits the whole family will enjoy.

Experience what it is like to be President of the United States as you follow President Carter through a single day in the White House. Six giant monitors and four smaller monitors surround you as a clock ticks off the minutes for December 11, 1978, from President's Carter's 5:30 am wake-up call until he goes to bed around 11:30pm. During the day, Carter must deal with issues of health care, immigration, immunization, the Middle East, energy, transportation, the economy and much more. You'll be amazed at how many issues faced by President Carter are still being dealt with by the White House today.

Students can learn what it is like to do research with source documents at a Presidential Library. Interactive displays let you sample what it is like to go through the archive stacks at the Carter Library.

Visitors can step into an exact replica of the Oval Office, see the Nobel Peace Prize and other awards given to President Carter and for the first time, see examples of the Carters work after leaving the White House.

Kids of all ages will enjoy the high-tech, interactive TABLE which enables you to take a virtual trip around the world with the Carters to fight disease and promote democracy. Each time you "visit" countries to work on problems of guinea worm, human rights and other issues, your electronic passport will be stamped and you can email it to yourself.
