Free Admission to 25 Year Olds  
Prizes and Surprises

**Atlanta, GA.** - The Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum turns 25 on Saturday, October 1<sup>st</sup>. In honor of our 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and President Carter's 87<sup>th</sup> birthday, we'll have a day filled with prizes and surprises.

We'll be giving free admission to the award-winning Carter Presidential Museum to anyone who is 25 years old. So bring your ID. There will be drawings throughout the day for one of 5 autographed books by President Carter and we'll have free showings Jonathan Demme's acclaimed movie Jimmy Carter, Man from Plains at 10am and 1pm.

Visitors also will be able to see the fabulous exhibition *Read My Pins: The Madeleine Albright Collection*. More than two hundred pins worn by former Secretary of State Madeleine Albright...many of which were used to send a diplomatic message... are on display. You'll be amazed at these pins; the variety, the size and most importantly, the story behind them. This is an exhibition the whole family will enjoy.

You'll also be able to see a brand new exhibit honoring the Secret Service. This exhibit tells the history of the Secret Service, from its early role investigating counterfeiting to its most visible role, protecting the President.

If you haven't seen the award-winning Carter Presidential Museum, this Saturday will be a great time to do it. It is filled with high-tech, interactive exhibits, as well as historic artifacts, photographs and documents. The Georgia Association of Museums and Galleries named it "Institution of the Year." Atlanta Magazine and the Atlantan magazine selected it as a Best of Atlanta.

After visiting the museum, be sure to stroll the beautifully landscaped grounds, with two small lakes, a Japanese Garden and a Rose Garden. Bring a picnic and enjoy lunch on the picnic tables. The Carter Presidential Library and Museum invites you to visit what Atlanta Magazine calls "a local treasure."

Conveniently located 3 miles east of downtown Atlanta and just a mile and a half from the Martin Luther King Historic Site, the Carter Museum is open every day except Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years Day. There is plenty of free parking. Adult admission is \$8; seniors (60+) are \$6, military and students with ID's are \$6 and kids 16 and under are free.
