Politics Takes Center Stage At Carter Library Former Congressman Tom Allen & Vice Pres. Al Gore

Atlanta, GA. – The Jimmy Carter Presidential Library Author Series focuses on politics with its next two author lectures.

On Thursday, January 24th at 7:00 pm, former Maine Congressman Tom Allen discusses the gridlock in Washington. His new book is ***Dangerous Convictions: What's Really Wrong with the U.S. Congress.*** *Publishers Weekly* says "Tom Allen, a former Democratic congressman from Maine and current president and CEO of the American Association of Publishers, offers a panoramic critique of Congress based on his 12 years in office (1997-2009), covering policy areas from the budget to health care....Allen's pragmatism and reason help frame major issues for Americans hungering for some legislative wisdom after the election."

Because of his schedule, Vice President Gore will not be personalizing books.
