## **March Author Series**

**Atlanta, GA.** –The Jimmy Carter Presidential Library’s Book Signing Series continues with four free author programs in March. All these events are in the Carter Museum Theater and begin at 7:00pm. ACappella Books will be selling books at each event. Here’s the schedule for March.

### **March 5 ...Paul Pressly..... *On the Rim of the Caribbean: Colonial Georgia and the British Atlantic World***

The Carter Library and the Ossabaw Island Education Alliance welcome author Paul Pressly for a discussion of his book "*On the Rim of the Caribbean.*" Pressly examines the ways in which Georgia came to share many of the characteristics of the sugar islands; how Savannah developed as a "Caribbean" town; the dynamics of an emerging slave market, and the role of merchant-planters.

### **March 21 ...Gyanendra Pandey.. *A History of Prejudice: Race, Caste, and Difference in India and the United States***

Gyanendra Pandey, the leading subaltern historian, examines the multiple dimensions of prejudice in two of the world’s leading democracies. This is a book about prejudice and democracy, and the prejudice of democracy.

### **March 26 ..James Hunt...*Restless Fires: John Muir's Thousand Mile Walk to the Gulf***

The Carter Library and the Sierra Club host James Hunt for a discussion of the travels of John Muir. Hunt effectively makes the case that Muir was profoundly affected by his travels through the Southern United States in ways that significantly shaped the future direction of his life.

### **March 27 ... Stuart E. Eizenstat,.....*The Future of the Jews: How Global Forces are Impacting the Jewish People, Israel, and Its Relationship with the United States***

The Carter Library and the World Affairs Council host Stuart Eizenstat for a discussion of his book, "The Future of the Jews." Eizenstat surveys the major geopolitical, economic, and security challenges facing the world in general, and the Jewish world and the United States in particular.
