Author Series Changes *One Presentation Postponed...Another has a Speaker Change*

Atlanta, GA. – The scheduled talk (March 21) and book signing by Emory professor Gyanendra Pandey, about his book *A History of Prejudice: Race, Caste, and Difference in India and the United States* is being postponed to assure that we'll have copies of his book available at the talk. We regret the delay and will let everyone know when it is rescheduled.

Civil Rights leader and MLK aide Andrew Young had planned author Jonathan Rieder for his April 10th discussion of the book *Gospel of Freedom: Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Letter from Birmingham Jail and the Struggle That Changed a Nation*. Unfortunately a schedule conflict will prevent Young from participating. We hope to have another civil rights leader take part. Rieder delves deeper than anyone before into Martin Luther King's Letter from Birmingham Jail-illuminating both its timeless message and its position in the history of civil rights.
