May 15 at 7:00....Jim Wallis.....*On God’s Side: What Religion Forgets and Politics Hasn’t Learned About Serving the Common Good.*

May 16 at 7:00pm....Saru Jayaraman...*Behind the Kitchen Door*

How do restaurant workers live on some of the lowest wages in America? And how do poor working conditions-discriminatory labor practices, exploitation, and unsanitary kitchens-affect the meals that arrive at our restaurant tables? Saru Jayaraman, sets out to answer these questions by following the lives of restaurant workers.

May 20 at 7:00pm....Larry Colton...*Southern League : A True Story of Baseball, Civil Rights, and the Deep South's Most Compelling Pennant Race*

Former pro pitcher Larry Colton, who played for the Philadelphia Phillies, tells the story of the Southern League's 1964 Birmingham Barons, the first integrated sports team in Alabama, as they competed at the height of the civil rights protests.

May 21 at 7:00pm...Gianna Angelopoulos...*My Greek Drama: Life, Love and One Woman’s Olympic Effort to Bring Glory to Her Country.*

In 1996, the prime minister of Greece appointed Gianna Angelopoulos to lead the country’s successful campaign to host the 2004 Olympic Games. In 2000, when slow progress and gridlocked bureaucracy put Athens in danger of losing the Games, she was asked to assume the presidency of the Athens 2004 Organizing Committee and save the project. This is her story.

All of these book signings will be held in the Carter Presidential Museum Theater. They are free and open to the public. ***ACappella Books*** will have copies of the books available for purchase and signing.
