August Special Events

Atlanta, ---We have a couple more special events in August that you'll want to attend. On Monday, August 20th, we're showing off our new photo exhibit on the Vietnam War in 1968 and you'll be able to meet the photographer. The next week, we'll host community activist and civil rights lawyer Arjun Singh Sethi for a discussion of his book "*American Hate*." Both programs are in the Carter Presidential Museum and are free. Here are the details:

August 20... "*Innocent Souls: Vietnam 1968*" Reception, Program and Tour of the Temporary Exhibition

"*Innocent Souls: Vietnam 1968*" is an exhibition of images captured by "soldier with a camera" 1st Lieutenant Glenn Hoover. Comprised of 45 images, the exhibition shows different aspects of those affected by the Vietnam War at its peak - from the young American soldiers to the Vietnamese and Montagnard people of Vietnam. From 6pm until 7pm, there will be a light reception in the museum lobby. At 7pm, photographer Glenn Hoover will discuss his photographs and his time in Vietnam. Afterwards, we'll tour the exhibition.

August 22... Arjun Singh Sethi ...*American Hate: Survivors Speak Out*

In "*American Hate: Survivors Speak Out*", Arjun Singh Sethi, a community activist and civil rights lawyer, chronicles the stories of individuals affected by hate. In a series of powerful, unfiltered testimonials, survivors tell their stories in their own words and describe how current bigoted rhetoric and policies have intensified bullying, discrimination, and even violence toward them and their communities. The program begins at 7pm in the museum theater.
