President Carter Book Signing

Atlanta, GA- President Jimmy Carter will be signing copies of his new book *Faith: A Journey for All* on Wednesday, April 11th at 5:30 pm at the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library in Atlanta. *This will be a wristband event so please read the guidelines below.*

Location: Carter Museum Lobby

- 1) You **Must** purchase a copy of President Carter's new book *Faith: A Journey for All* from the Jimmy Carter Museum Store to be in the Signing Line.
- 2) With the purchase of *Faith: A Journey for All* you will be given a wristband that will allow you to be in the signing line. **YOU MUST HAVE THE WRISTBAND on to get in the signing line.** The wristband's number tag will be removed when you get in the signing line. **Do Not remove it yourself.**
- 3) In addition to *Faith: A Journey for All* wristband holders can have **TWO** additional prior titles by President Carter signed.
- 4) President Carter will **NOT** be signing photos or memorabilia. Books will not be personalized.
- 5) We encourage you to purchase your book from the museum store in advance of the event.
- 6) Members of *Friends of the Jimmy Carter Library* will get priority in the signing line as well as a discount on purchases at the Museum Store.
- 7) Photos at the signing table are prohibited.

- 8) You will go through security to enter the museum. Please do not bring large bags, purses, backpacks, etc.
- 9) The signing line will form outside the Carter Presidential Museum at 3:00 pm.

Monday, March 26...Anna Leahy.. *Tumor*

Anna Leahy explores why and how tumors happen, how we think and talk about them, and how we try to rid ourselves of them. According to David Eagleman, Stanford neuroscientist, New York Times bestselling author, "Leahy looks a tough subject right in the eyes, and tells its story with grace, insight, alacrity, and wit."

Wednesday, March 28...Kevin Shird & Nelson Malden.. *The Colored Waiting Room*

In *The Colored Waiting Room*, activist Kevin Shird heads to Montgomery to meet eighty-four-year-old Nelson Malden and discuss the significance of recent racially motivated events. The result is a groundbreaking understanding of today's burgeoning second-wave civil rights movement.

Thursday, March 29...Anthony Ray Hinton.. *The Sun Does Shine (in the Carter Center's Cecil B. Day Chapel)*

This is a powerful, revealing story by a man who spent thirty years on death row for a crime he didn't commit. It is a story of hope, love, and eventually, justice.

Monday April 2... Johnny Smith .. *A Season in the Sun*

Acclaimed historians Randy Roberts and Johnny Smith recount the defining moment of Mickey Mantle's legendary career: 1956, when he overcame a host of injuries and critics to become the most celebrated athlete of his time.

Thursday April 5... Menno Schilthuizen ... *Darwin Comes to Town*

In *Darwin Comes to Town*, evolutionary biologist Menno Schilthuizen shows that evolution can in fact happen extremely quickly, and in the strangest of places: the heart of the city.

Monday April 9... Ambassador Andrew Young ... *Memphis: Facing the Cross (Film screening)*

This is Ambassador Andrew Young's first-person account of Martin Luther King's final days and legacy in the moving, inspirational documentary. Ambassador Young will also be here to discuss the film.
