



When any one organisation handels the amount of cases that Blue Shield of San Francisco does, the waste and intangelment is enormous.

I also would like to suggest a Pilot Program on a small scale to test it and get the bugs out. So many Federal Programs get in gear before the printing is even out for the instructions.
