Boyer, State U. Head, Appointed Federal Education Commissioner

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19—Dr. Ernest L. Boyer, chancellor of the State University of New York, was named today to be the next United States Commissioner of Education.

The selection of the 48-year-old educator to administer Federal education programs was announced by Joseph A. Califano, Secretary-designate of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. It was also announced today that Mr. Carter had selected Clifford M. Alexander Jr., 43, a Washington lawyer, as Secretary of the Army, Graham William Claytor Jr., 51, chairman of the Board of the Southern Railway Company, as Secretary of the Navy, and Thomas B. Ross, 47, the former Washington bureau chief of The Chicago Sun-Times, as Assistant Secretary of Defense for Public Affairs.

Mr. Alexander will be the first black person ever to head a branch of the armed services in this nation.

Meanwhile, in Plains, Ga., President-elect Carter announced the appointment of five sub-Cabinet officers in the Department whose pending nominations were previously reported. They are:

- Hale Champion, 54, financial vice president of Harvard University, as Under Secretary.
- Bileen Shanahan, 42, economics reporter for The New York Times, Washington Bureau, Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs.
- Dr. Henry Aaron, 40, economist and senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, as Assistant Secretary of planning and evaluation.
- Dr. Mary F. Berry, 38, chancellor of the University of Colorado, Boulder, as Assistant Secretary for Education.

Arabella Martinez, 39, a social program manager and consultant, Assistant Secretary for Human Development.

The new officials are expected to begin work in the new administration Friday, entering an agency where all 142 non-Civil Service, political appointees have been asked to be out of their offices by tonight.

Their resignations had been asked for weeks ago, but because no replacements had been appointed for the overwhelming number of appointees, many in those jobs were surprised to be called in yesterday and today and told to leave by the close of business today.
