SUBJECT: To Greet staff, Secretary Ray Marshall, Treasurer Azie Taylor Morton, and Muhammad Ali at reception, Tuesday, April 10, 1979, 4:00 P.M. - Room 308 Old Executive Office Building

I. PURPOSE

To greet Secretary Ray Marshall, Treasurer Azie Taylor Morton, Deputy Secretary of Treasury Robert Carswell, Muhammad Ali and staff at reception after today's press conference.

II. BACKGROUND, PARTICIPATION AND PRESS

A. Background: Mrs. Azie Taylor Morton, U.S. Treasurer and Director of the U.S. Savings Bond Division, has invited Muhammad Ali to be the honorary chairman of the 1979 Savings Bond Campaign for Federal employees. Secretary Ray Marshall is the chairman.

The kickoff of the campaign is slated for Wednesday, April 11, 1979 at 10:30 a.m. in the Inter-Departmental Auditorium at 14th and Constitution Avenue, N.W.

In 1978 Federal employees bought \$1.1 billion of Savings Bonds. The 1978 report shows that 91 percent of the White House staff participated.

The total goal for U.S. Savings Bonds for the nation in 1979 is \$8.3 billion.

Muhammad Ali was born in Louisville, Kentucky on January 18, 1942. He won the world heavyweight boxing championship in 1964, by knocking out Sonny Liston. In 1975 his earnings were over \$6 million.
