The cumulative total on public responses to your speeches given 7/15/79 and 7/16/79 through midnight 7/16/79 are as follows:

While general support was overwhelming, by far the most frequently mentioned subject was the public's support for your emphasis on rebuilding the American spirit.

With regard to the energy program outlined over the past two days, all action steps were supported, but the most frequently mentioned are listed below:
