


This is to express my concern over drug use and trafficking by federal employees of the Department of Labor.

The Washington police force has suggested that the recent incident at the Department of Labor is "probably typical of drug use at the other Federal agencies." I believe it is a national disgrace that Federal drug laws are being violated by Federal Employees, on Federal property, and on the Government's time. Moreover, the bureaucracy, which is already characterized as "inefficient," is further burdened by drug use.

This is intolerable, and I strongly feel that a concerted effort should be made to insure that these practices are eradicated. I would be very interested in knowing what steps you plan to take along these lines.
