Dr. Eck in his article "Synthetic Fuels: A False Start?" uses the familiar institutional device of prematurely lamenting the failure of a feared competitor whose operations have yet to be launched. In this case his fears are groundless. The U. S. Synthetic Fuel Corporation (SFC) has not yet been incorporated. The Board of Directors has not been confirmed; the staff has not been selected. No contracts have been let. No funds have been disbursed. The current spate of government sponsored activities in the synthetic fuels field are an improvised melange of ventures undertaken under preliminary features of the Energy Security Act of 1980 and prior law by the Department of Energy, the Defense Department, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Interior, and the Environmental Protection Agency. Much of the money being used at this point will be subtracted from that initially available to the SFC.

The SFC, whose founding is called for by the Energy Security Act of 1980, was chartered because the Congress and the Administration had nowhere else to go. In the six years elapsed since the Arab Oil Embargo it had become painfully clear that the large corporations who might have turned their capital and technological resources to a diminution of our dangerous dependence on insecure imported oil by the development of synthetic fuels, could not, or would not, do so as long as they could continue to gamble profitably on the handling of foreign oil. Conventional economics applauds their decision, short-sighted as it may be from a national security viewpoint. But then, conventional economics probably argued against the production of Spitfire aircraft in England by English

firms prior to their need in the Battle of Britain. It is a function of government to transcend the norms of the marketplace where a people's survival is at stake.

Dr. Eck is undoubtedly correct in noting that there are flaws and deficiencies in the creating the SFC although his reading of the Act is superficial. For one thing, alcohol from biomass production providing for gasohol is not of the corporation's functions being left, as it were, to the mercies of the Departments of Energy and Agriculture whose contractors may well spend more money advertising gasohol than producing it. In the compromises necessarily attending passage of the Act Congress has also emerged looking definitely "penny-wise and pound-foolish" in spite of the enormous funds appropriated. Also there is an emphasis in the Act on relying upon industry to an extent perhaps not warranted by recent performance in this area. Much attention is given to small business where big business may be inevitable. Clearly the SFC Board of Directors, in order to fulfill their mission, will have to appeal and even publicly lobby for a strengthening of their hands. The failure of the associated bill creating an Energy Mobilization Board is a serious preliminary drawback. Continuing strong presidential support is essential but not guaranteed. But Dr. Eck errs in asserting that the members of the board proposed by the President are a hapless lot of innocents thrown upon the turbulent sea of Big Oil.

John Sawhill has proven himself under prolonged fire in national energy affairs. Anyone thinking that James Kirkland of AFL-CIO is a stranger to a fight or that Frank Cary of IBM or

or John deButts of AT & T are unfamiliar with the processes of managing large-scale modern technologies is simply off-base.

As to Cecil Andrus, Frank Savage and Catherine Cleary; they bring backgrounds of acumen in public affairs, land management, environmental matters, and finance that would be hard to surpass in any boardroom in the country. They may not be "hard-nosed" enough to suit oil men -- but they are not "bull-headed" either.

Dr. Eck is also somewhat off-base in stating that "no known technical expert on synthetic fuels really believes (at least in private) that the United States can come close to meeting the energy production goals set for the SFC." Presumably he speaks for himself since big industry "experts" tend to cluster amongst themselves to deliver value judgements on what can be done in this country as colored by their perceptions of what ought to be done. There is no question whatsoever but that we have the resources to achieve the goals set by Congress and more beside. It is, instead, a question of whether we will actively pursue these goals before we face disaster.

The overall point that Dr. Eck none too subtly conveys is that, SFC or no SFC, our national synthetic fuel program can do no better than limp along without the whole-hearted support of the giants of the fuel industry such his own company, Standard Oil of Indiana. Dr. Eck is dead right. The SFC was conceived of as a patriotic and necessary cooperative venture by government with private industry. It is not competitive with any existing industry any more than were our government-sponsored synthetic rubber efforts

(which led to the founding of a lucrative private industry) in World War II. It dissolves automatically in 1997. As matters stand, any crude produced by the SFC must eventually enter the private U.S. refining and distribution system -- if they accept it -- in order to emerge in useful form as marketable gasoline, jet fuel, heating oil, and so forth. Although we often hear that we have too few refineries, it must be noted that the existing U.S. refinery capacity exceeds by some 7 mbpd the conventional petroleum producing capacity of the country. Thus, if our refineries are to run at full tilt (when we are not suffering a recession or when we are engaged in or embarrassed by a war shutting off oil imports) the choice must be made as to imported oil or domestically-produced synthetic oil which cannot be shut-off.

One concurs wholeheartedly, therefore, with Dr. Eck's concluding paragraph, "Realistically, a large synthetic fuel industry will not be achieved unless large corporations are permitted and indeed encouraged to commit their talents." Hopefully these major oil corporations will review the national situation, reconsider a few on-going exigencies in the Middle East, and quickly conclude that their ultimate survival is indeed bound-up with the national interest. One confides that they will then commit their talents accordingly and that the SFC will make room at the inn.

## Synthetic Fuels: False Start?

THE proponents of the Government's Synthetic Fuels Corporation, established under the Energy Policy Act signed three months ago by President Carter, are numerous and many Congressmen and influential citizens (including some with a keen eye for a synthetic-fuel dollar) have been quick to hail it as the center of the nation's energy policy: development of synthetic liquid and gas fuels from coal, biomass and oil deposits would turn the tide of dependence on OPEC, re-balance our trade and make the nation great.

Proponents of S.F.C. have been almost as numerous. Environmentalists have hailed synthetic fuels as mind-blowing alternatives to ozone-depleters, despoilers of the land and exterminators of countless species of the small darter. Free-market advocates see S.F.C. as another step toward greater state involvement in productive enterprise. Supporters of other sources of energy see the Government as taking an unnecessary risk with taxpayers' money that could be spent more effectively elsewhere in the energy marketplace. Agricultural interests see the corporation as a competitor for fast-flowing water supplies.

In the middle are state and local officials in areas where synthetic fuel projects are to be located. They want the jobs and the tax revenues, but they must provide much of the infrastructure — roads, schools, recreation facilities — that these projects require. They also must contend with any constituents who don't need more traffic and wish S.F.C. to just go away.

In this setting, S.F.C. is now trying to get together. Obviously, it will be struggling before a packed house and precedentedly diverse levels of public participation. The failure of the Energy Select Committee to bolster the Energy Mobilization Board leaves S.F.C. further exposed.

It does not have to be cynical to ask skeptically of S.F.C.: "Will it ever work? Or, more to the point, "Will it work well?"

In my own 20-year perspective on government/private energy relations,

the best answer I can give is that I do hope the corporation will work well, but I'm afraid it will only just work.

Let me illustrate how S.F.C. will work in, some fashion. Any bureaucracy with an initial budget of \$20 billion and a future call on \$23 billion more is bound to stay in business for several years; to do any less would shake our faith in Government.

Let me state further that no known technical expert on synthetic fuels really believes (at least in private) that the United States can come close to meeting the energy production goals set for S.F.C.: 500,000 barrels daily of crude oil equivalent by 1987 and two million barrels by 1992.

The management of the corporation thus is challenged with the antithesis of the classic public policy problem: It has vast financial resources at its disposal, but few really good ways to use them and scant hope of meeting its mandate.

The current nominees to the corporation's board are a commendable group, but collectively they have very little background in energy technology or management of large energy projects. Blue-ribbon public service credentials are no substitute for hard-nosed experience in mobilizing and managing massive engineering projects. If they are to succeed, they are going to have to deal quickly and effectively with S.F.C.'s built-in problems. I can see several.

First of all, S.F.C. is much more likely to succeed if it sees its task simply as pushing along all fronts the most rapid possible commercial development of our synthetic-fuel potential. It cannot simultaneously try to break up OPEC, end urban blight, clean up our rivers and halt inflation.

The fact that it almost certainly can't meet the overly ambitious production goals set by Congress shouldn't cause it to abandon its task, but this should provide a sobering initiation for its leadership.

Secondly, there are signs that the corporation may rapidly develop a bad case of the "R&D Syndrome." Certainly, synthetic-fuel research must be done, but there is a universal tendency for "research and development" to spawn further research, forever and ever, so long as the money holds out.

S.F.C. must accept the risk that some good-sized projects will fail if it is

ever going to get us into the commercial production of synthetic fuels.

Thirdly, S.F.C. must realize that it is competing for the same scarce human and technical resources that serve other energy industries, and these other uses may be every bit as useful to society as synthetic fuels. The corporation also risks bottlenecks in obtaining the equipment its projects will need: It is of dubious value to push through a synthetic-fuel experiment if it means postponing offshore oil-production platforms, power-plant boilers or an economically viable shale oil plant.

Fourthly, I think S.F.C. must take a hard look at the economic incentives Congress provided to see how well they actually work. These include loans, loan and price guarantees, purchase agreements and joint ventures, support that is heavily biased toward rewarding failure and inefficiency.

If the Government agrees to buy synthetic fuels at a fail-safe price, what incentives do producers have to keep down costs? How should S.F.C. choose projects in a new industry where there are no benchmarks? The opportunities for political favoritism are rampant in this complex process of handing out goodies.

I think the corporation is going to have to go back to Congress for a second look at the incentives question. Much greater participation in the synthetic-fuel effort could be engaged by limited front-end grants to a variety of projects; beyond that, they should sink or swim on their merits. No one in synthetic-fuel production expects to see real profit for years.

Finally, I hope the Synthetic Fuels Corporation is able to sidestep the political fear currently prevailing in Washington over dealing with oil companies, especially large ones.

Politics aside, synthetic fuel is fundamentally the same liquid and gaseous hydrocarbon material that the industry has produced for decades with great efficiency. The industry has an incomparable reservoir of technical competence that is a precious American natural resource in its own right.

Realistically, a large synthetic-fuel industry will not be achieved unless large corporations are permitted to be indeed encouraged to commit themselves.



SUMMARY OF DAILY POLITICAL REPORT

October 20, 1980

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Connecticut. Hartford Courant poll: Reagan 37, Carter 35, Anderson 16, Undecided 16.

Delaware. Former Governor Elbert Carvel endorsed Carter on 10/20. NOW criticized Reagan's judgeship record.

New York. The New York Post endorsed Reagan, who is "amiable, consistent, at ease." Carter is "indecisive, incompetent and weak, even if hard-working."

Kentucky. Mondale emphasized coal in Kentucky trip, and Governor Brown says the state has benefitted from energy development funds.

Mississippi. Sonny Montgomery endorsed Carter.

North Carolina. Bobby Smith got good press for his tobacco announcement.

South Carolina. Anderson state coordinator David Haskell defected and endorsed Carter, and did statewide radio feeds.

Tennessee. Two local Reagan staffers are getting press because they are admitted members of the Klan.

Illinois. Chicago Tribune statewide poll: Carter 45, Reagan 42, Anderson 12.

Michigan. Detroit Free Press endorsed Carter. The Ralph Abernathy endorsement of Reagan is viewed very negatively by Blacks in Michigan.

Minnesota. Joan Mondale had a very good trip.

Missouri. St. Louis Post-Dispatch poll: Reagan 36, Carter 32, Anderson 6, undecided 19.

Ohio. Cleveland Plain Dealer endorsed Reagan. Strauss got good reaction from his Ohio press briefing.

Wisconsin. Milwaukee County poll: Carter 40, Reagan 26, Anderson 13, Undecided 20. Milwaukee Journal says Anderson's race is over; voters should choose between Reagan and Carter.

Idaho. Senator Church spoke out for Carter, and it was noted in the press that this is one of the few times he has done so.

South Dakota. Kennedy will campaign for Senator McGovern.

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

Subject: Prime Rate

As you undoubtedly know by now, the prime rate was raised to 14 percent today by a large number of banks. Unlike the Citibank increase of 2 weeks ago, this one appears to be justified by the formula that Citibank uses (which bases the prime on the prior 3 weeks average rate on certificate of deposits plus 1-1/2 percent).

If you are asked to comment on this, I would suggest the following points:

1. Unlike the initial increase to 14 percent that one of the major banks put into affect a few weeks ago, the recent increase is about in line with the usual formula which is often used in setting the prime rate. Nevertheless, as Chairman Volcker noted several weeks ago, the prime rate does seem jumpier on the upside than it does on the downside.
2. More importantly, according to recent press reports, Chairman Volcker and several of the largest private bankers appear to believe -- and I agree with them -- that the country's financial markets may have overreacted to what's going on in the economy and to Federal Reserve policy. Interest rates seem to be somewhat out of line with underlying economic conditions.
3. As one indication of that fact, the latest compilation of private economic forecasts (42 well-known private forecasts collected by Blue Chip Economic Indicators) projects the inflation rate to fall to 9-1/2 percent in the final quarter of this year and to 8-3/4 percent over the four quarters of 1981. Interest rates at current levels, including the prime rate at 14 percent, seem too high in an economy with that kind of an inflation outlook and with economic recovery just beginning.

4. As you know, I have continued to insist that we need budgetary and monetary restraint to fight inflation. That is why, for example, I fought so hard to prevent a quickie pre-election tax cut that would simply have swelled the budget deficit and made inflation worse. And that is why I have opposed massive deficit-creating tax cuts such as those advocated by Governor Reagan. So I am not suggesting any relaxation of anti-inflationary policies. But I am saying that interest rates may have gotten out of line recently with the requirements of a vigorous anti-inflation policy.
