

SUBJECT: Report of the Quadrennial Commission on Executive,  
Legislative and Judicial Salaries

Attached are copies of the report of the quadrennial Commission on Executive, Legislative and Judicial Salaries and the text of a press release acknowledging White House receipt of the report. By law, you must consider the report and send your own recommendations for adjusting top officials' salaries to the Congress in January, as part of your FY 1982 Budget. We will give you soon a detailed analysis of the issues and options involved.

The Commission's report recommends substantial increases for executives, judges and Congressmen. At this point, you need make no comments on the contents of the report. The purpose of the press release is merely to acknowledge that you officially have received the document and to express your appreciation to the Commission's members. The Commission plans a press conference tomorrow at which they will release the report.

REPORT DELIVERED TO THE PRESIDENT

Quadrennial Commission on Executive, Legislative and Judicial Salaries

The President today received a report containing the recommendations of the quadrennial Commission on Executive, Legislative and Judicial Salaries. After careful study, the nine members of the Commission unanimously have urged that the salary levels of top Federal officials be increased substantially.

Under law, the President will review and consider the Commission's report and send his own recommendations for adjusting senior officials' pay to the Congress in January, as part of his fiscal 1982 Budget. The President's recommendations may be the same as, or differ from, those of the Commission. The report of the quadrennial Commission will be released on December 16 by its Chairman, Joseph H. McConnell.

The President wishes to express his appreciation for the work of the Commission's members and the leadership of Chairman McConnell. The other members include Thomas R. Donahue, Martha W. Griffiths, Robert P. Griffin, Edward P. Morgan, Sherman Hazeltine, Richard W. Young, Bernard G. Segal, and Otis M. Smith.
