MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

Subject: Retroactive Social Services Legislation --
Signing Ceremony

The Congress has passed the Administration's Bill settling \$2.4 billion of disputes between the States and HEW. These disputes involved payments for social service provided by the States with Federal dollars. \$1.56 billion represent State claims that were never paid by HEW and the balance represents payments that had been made by HEW, but whose validity the Department challenged.

The settlement involves a one-time Federal payment of \$543 million to 19 affected States and an agreement by all sides to drop all pending or contemplated legal proceedings. All States are affected by this agreement written into the Bill. I have attached a list of the States and the payments each will receive for your information.

This dispute covering payments before 1975 represented the single largest irritant in HEW State relations when your Administration assumed office.

I recommend that you hold a brief signing ceremony at the White House. It will be an excellent opportunity for you to demonstrate the new intergovernmental relationship that you have brought to the Federal Government.

If you concur, in addition to the appropriate Members of Congress, a substantial number of Governors should be invited to participate. With your approval, my staff will work with Frank Moore and Jack Watson to arrange the event.
