CIVIL RIGHTS REPORTER AND WHITE HOUSE PHOTOGRAPHER TO SPEAK AT CARTER LIBRARY FREE AUTHOR LECTURES & BOOK SIGNINGS ON NOV. 6TH & 15TH

ATLANTA, GA.- Civil Rights movement reporter Hank Klibanoff and White House photojournalist Diana Walker bring their unique perspective and personal stories to the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum as part of the Library's free author lecture series in November.

On Monday, November 6th at 7:30 p.m., Hank Klibanoff will discuss the daunting and often dangerous challenge of reporting on the Civil Rights movement during the 1950's and 60's. Klibanoff is co-author of "The Race Beat: The Press, the Civil Rights Struggle and the Awakening of a Nation." Publishers Weekly calls the book "a gripping account of how America and the world found out about the Civil Rights movement." Following the free lecture, Klibanoff will sign copies of his book. The program is co-sponsored by the Georgia Center for the Book, and Barnes and Noble.
