President Carter & Chinese Delegation to Open New Photo Exhibit

Exhibition Highlights 30 Years of US-China Diplomatic Relations

Atlanta, GA. - President Jimmy Carter and representatives from the People's Republic of China will officially open the new exhibit "Looking Back After 30 Years: A Photo Exhibition Marking the 30th Anniversary of China-US Diplomatic Relations."

The opening ceremony and ribbon-cutting will be Thursday, December 3rd at 2:30 pm in the lobby of the All New Carter Presidential Museum.

In the three decades since former President Jimmy Carter normalized relations with China, the relationship between China and the world has grown more complex. China's economic system is now the third largest in the world and has become the world's greatest exporter of goods. This photo exhibition looks not only at the changes that have taken place over the years, but also to the future relationship between these two great nations.

Joining President Carter for the opening ceremony will be Madam Li Xiaolin (Vice President of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries), Xu Kuangdi (Vice Chairman of the 10th National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference), Madam Gao Yanping (Consul General of the People's Republic of China in Houston), Beverly Hall (Superintendent of the Atlanta Public Schools) and Carter Library Director Jay Hakes.

The exhibition opening ceremony is open to the public. "Looking Back After 30 Years" will be on display at the All New Carter Presidential Museum from December 3, 2009 thru February 7, 2010.
