SUBJECT: Ambassador Smith's Proposed Nonproliferation Initiatives (C)

I understand you will shortly be considering guidance for Gerry Smith's proposed European and Japanese explorations on improving the nonproliferation regime. I strongly support authorizing Ambassador Smith to move forward expeditiously with his proposed explorations. (C)

In order to get the most effective regime, we should be willing to authorize on a more predictable basis, the reprocessing of U.S.-origin spent fuel and use of the resulting plutonium in specified breeder and advanced reactor research, development, and demonstration programs. I believe domestic reaction would be manageable and the approach would require no change in law. (C)

I believe it will be important to obtain meaningful concessions from our allies in return for liberalizing our nuclear supply policies. I therefore endorse the approach outlined in Ambassador Smith's memorandum, whereby the U.S. will seek assurances regarding the deferral of thermal recycle, caution in the construction of new reprocessing plants, greater cooperation among nuclear supplier countries, and other measures to strengthen the international nonproliferation regime. (C)

I further believe that the proposed consultations should be conducted in an exploratory, low key fashion, and that specific proposals should be referred back for your approval. (C)
